## 2016 IN REVIEW

2016 was an exciting and productive year at the Community Arts Partnership. Thanks to contributions made by the Tompkins County Tourism Program, a friendly Foundation, and the New York State Council on the Arts we had an increase of funding that we were able to distribute to arts organizations and to individual artists this year. Funding from the New York State Council on the Arts and the Regional Economic Development Council enabled CAP to bring on additional part-time staff in 2016 for the first time in this organization's history.

The Greater Ithaca Trail continues to attract regional visitors, the Spring Writes Festival had more programming and participating artists than any other previous year, and the Ithaca Artist Market was (as usual) a smash hit. Our 2017 Poet Laureate, Zee Zahava, has hit the ground running and has been organizing multiple readings and workshops.

CAP expanded its outreach in 2016 to include emerging and established arts organizations so we may better understand the current state of local art and culture. We want to know the people and organizations that make up our creative economy, what challenges and opportunities they face, and what additional roles CAP can play in strengthening our regional arts culture.

Looking forward to 2017! ... Advocating for the arts, always a part of CAP's mission, has taken on a new urgency in the wake of reports of funding cuts for the arts. Knowing the critical issues, the relevant legislation, and the politicians of influence, both in Albany and Washington, are a higher priority than we might have imagined a year ago.

## THE SERVICES WE PROVIDE

### Artist Career and Project Guidance

A core, on-going activity is the informational, practical and technical assistance we give to local artists on a daily basis.

### On-Line Resource Director

CAP's website, ArtsPartner.org, features a collection of links and guides, providing artists with starting points for further development of their craft and careers.

### Workshops

CAP provides year-round practical workshops for artists on subjects relevant to the business of making art.

### Artist Consulting Program

Consultants are chosen as a resource to artists who need advanced advice and guidance.

### Tompkins Poet Laureate

Beginning in 2008, CAP acquired New York State Council for the Arts funding to support the programs of our poet laureate and allow the artist to have multiple public readings and workshops.

The current poet laureate is Zee Zahara.

### On-Line Artist Registry

Artists of all disciplines are invited to be on our searchable database at ArtsPartner.org.

# CAP'S PUBLIC PROGRAMS

We Connect Artists with Audiences

Since 1999, 27,000 visitors have enjoyed the trail. 500 artists have earned \$850,000.

Since 1996, 570 artists have hung work in CAP's Gallery. Gallery Night receptions have brought in 48,000 visitors to our gallery.

Since 1994, 42,000 visitors have attended the markets. 1,700 artists have earned over \$1,000,000.

Since 2010, 500 authors and playwrights have presented their work to 7,000 regional visitors.

## GREATER ITHACA ART TRAIL

The Art trail is a self guided tour of 40 local working artists' studios spread throughout Tompkins County. Studios are open year-round by appointment, on two consecutive October weekends, and the First Saturday of each month. The ArtTrail.com site has artist profiles and downloadable maps.



## CAP ARTSPACE

CAP's "ArtSpace," located in Center Ithaca, showcases monthly exhibits and is used for workshops, Ithaca Downtown Alliance events, and shares space with the Downtown Visitors Center.



## ITHACA ARTIST MARKET

Each year, CAP organizes and facilitates a summer juried show and sale of work by local artists of all disciplines. The market, located at the Ithaca Farmers Market, is a banner event and a true showcase of local arts.



## SPRING WRITES LITERARY FESTIVAL

CAP's annual Spring Writes Literary Festival began in 2009 at the request of New York State Council on the Arts. NYSCA staff knew there was a wealth of literary talent in the area, but few opportunities for writers to connect with the book-loving public. The result was the Spring Writes Festival, which takes place over 4 days each May, and features over 30 literary themed events.



# THE GRANTS WE ADMINISTER

Funding for Artists and Arts Organizations

Since 1992, CAP has distributed over 4 million dollars to local artists, arts organizations and not-for-profits for local arts programming.

## 2016 GRANTS FOR ARTS PROGRAMS (GAP) - \$46,450

Funded through NYSCA, GAP grants for not-for-profit organizations make funds available to libraries, arts organizations, towns, villages, community centers and the like for professional arts and cultural projects. Available in every county in NY State, CAP administers the GAP grant for Tompkins County.

## 2016 ARTIST IN COMMUNITY GRANT - \$5,000

Funded through NYSCA, Artist in Community Grants supports the creation of new work of artists whose interaction with communities is an integral part of their art-making. Available in many NY State counties, CAP secures and administers this funding for Tompkins County artists.

## 2016 ARTS EDUCATION GRANT - \$8,950

Funded through NYSCA, the Arts Education grants are designed to assist artists and schools in developing and implementing visual and performing arts residencies that are integrated into core curriculum.

## 2016 STRATEGIC OPPORTUNITY STIPEND TOMPKINS - \$24,000

The new Strategic Opportunity Stipend Tompkins (SOS Tompkins) launched in July of 2014. CAP's SOS program was inspired by a now defunct New York Foundation for the Arts Program that assisted artists who needed funds for specific and strategic career opportunities. Funded with foundation support, CAP is happy to provide this additional funding for area artists.

## 2016 PUBLIC ART GRANT

Funded through a private foundation and the Tompkins County Tourism Program, this grant provides funding for local public art.

## TOMPKINS TOURISM: ARTS & CULTURE ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

CAP administers this program with funds from the Tompkins County Tourism Program. The goal is to stabilize and develop the arts and cultural tourism assets of the County. Recipients have included the Cayuga Chamber Orchestra, Hangar Theatre, The History Center in Tompkins County, Kitchen Theatre Company, Museum of the Earth/Cayuga Nature Center, Sciencenter, State Theatre, Community School of Music and Arts, Cinemapolis, and Ithaca Shakespeare.
