2024: Creative, collaborative, celebratory!

As we look back on 2024, we're proud to share the progress CAP has made in championing the arts throughout Tompkins County. This year has been defined by imagination, collaboration, and a renewed sense of purpose. None of this would be possible without the incredible support of our donors, partners, and the artists and arts groups who make this work not only possible—but powerful. Here's a look at some of the year's most exciting milestones.

1. A Year of Dynamic Cultural Events

Throughout 2024, CAP energized the community with a rich lineup of arts programming. The Spring Writes Literary Festival continued to foster a deep appreciation for the written word, bringing together authors and audiences in celebration of the literary arts. The Ithaca Artist Market flourished with more than 80 participating artists, creating opportunities for connection and commerce. The Greater Ithaca Art Trail expanded its reach with virtual studio visits, inviting art lovers near and far to experience the diversity and creativity of our local artists.

2. CAP ArtSpace: A Hub of Expression

The CAP ArtSpace remained a cornerstone of visual arts engagement, and featured twelve monthly exhibits that encouraged dialogue, reflection, and celebration of the creative spirit within our community. These shows featured both established and emerging artists, along with Ithaca College students and youth from the Greater Ithaca Activities Center.

3. Unprecedented Investment in Local Artists

In 2024 CAP administered \$596,698 in grants for the arts. This funding empowered individual artists, arts organizations, towns and villages, and community organizations to bring innovative projects to life and expand access to the arts across Tompkins County.

4. Sculpting Culture: Celebrating Community and Food Through Public Art

2024 also marked the steady progress of our Public Sculpture Program, an initiative designed to celebrate local culture around food. With the support of the Tompkins County Tourism Program, CAP is working with the Town of Enfield to launch the first in a trail of sculptures around the County centered around the community's culture and values related to food, including celebrating the food culture of the people indigenous to this place, the Gayogohó:no (Cayuga).

5. Honoring the Artistic Spirit

This year, CAP proudly led a community-wide celebration of the arts, honoring Community Arts Catalysts Yen Ospina and Caleb Thomas, and Friend of the Arts Martha Frommelt.

As we close out 2024, we are deeply thankful for the artists, advocates, and supporters who fuel this vibrant creative community. The arts continue to inspire change, build connections, and bring people together in meaningful ways. With your continued support, we look forward to a new year filled with fresh ideas, bold expression, and collective celebration.

2024 CAP PROGRAMS

We Connect Artists with Audiences

In 2024, there were over 2,000 visitors to Art Trail artists studios.

26th ANNUAL GREATER ITHACA ART TRAIL

The 26th annual Art Trail featured 55 artists throughout Tompkins County who connected with visitors at two October Open Studio weekends and Zoom events, monthly First Saturday openings, and a live and virtual annual group exhibit. Visit ArtTrail.com.

CAP ARTSPACE

CAP's ArtSpace is located in our home at the Tompkins Center for History and Culture. 2024 featured twelve monthly exhibits both live and virtual, with openings on Downtown Ithaca's First Friday Gallery Nights.



84 artists made excellent sales from over 2,000 visitors to the 2024 market.

32nd ANNUAL ITHACA ARTIST MARKET

The Ithaca Artist Market, a juried show and sale of work by local and regional artists, took place on a Friday in August at the Ithaca Farmers Market. 85 artists (visual and performing) were joined by community groups, arts organizations, and plenty of food, wine, cider and beer vendors. The East Hill Jazz Group played throughout the day, with performances by local arts groups by the dock and a boat tour by Discover Cayuga Lake.



1,400 people enjoyed 40 literary themed events in 2024. 120 writers participated!

16th ANNUAL SPRING WRITES LITERARY FESTIVAL

The 16th annual Literary Festival featured over 40 literary themed live and Zoom events. 30 panels, readings, and performances took place in May with 10 writing workshops that continued through December. Learn more and see video from past events at SpringWrites.org.

CAP-a-Palooza is CAP's annual fundraiser "Art Sale Extraordinaire" is an opportunity for community members to donate previously loved art, and a chance for the public to buy that art!



CAP'S SERVICES & INITIATIVES

A core ongoing CAP activity is the informational, practical, and technical assistance we give to artists and arts organizations.

ARTIST CAREER & PROJECT GUIDANCE

CAP staff meets with artists regularly to help with project development, inclusion into CAP programs and directions to resources.

GRANT WRITING ASSISTANCE

CAP runs multiple grant writing workshops and assists artists, arts organizations and not for profits with grant writing advice and guidance.

WORKSHOPS

In 2024, CAP hosted workshops on literary themes, grant writing, marketing, and fundraising.

COLLABORATIONS

CAP leads collaborations among the arts, government, businesses and the community at large to strengthen the arts in Tompkins County.

PUBLIC ART

CAP is leading a countywide public sculpture initiative celebrating local culture around food. CAP has commissioned Hammondsport artists Tony Moretti and Gwen Quigley, known jointly as Crows Nest Artists, to



create the first sculpture in the Town of Enfield.

TOMPKINS COUNTY POET LAUREATE

The position of Tompkins County Poet Laureate was established by the Tompkins County Legislature in 2001 to honor outstanding poets, integrate poetry into the community, and




enhance the County's position as a cultural center. The process is administered by CAP.


The 2023- 2024 poet laureate was Janie E. Bibbie.

CAP GRANT PROGRAMS

In 2024, CAP distributed \$596,698 to Tompkins County artists, arts organizations, villages/towns and not-for-profits. (Since 1992, that number has reached \$7.3 million!)

CAP funding not only makes local programming possible—it also provides essential validation. It shows our local artists and organizations that their work matters, that someone supports their events, careers, and contributions. It reinforces that Tompkins County is a place that values the arts and the people who create them.

NEW YORK STATE COUNCIL ON THE ARTS STATEWIDE REGRANT PROGRAM

2024 GRANTS FOR ARTS PROGRAMS (GAP) - \$144,604

Supports arts events and activities open to the general public.



2024 ARTIST IN COMMUNITY GRANT - \$26,950

Supports the creation of new work by artists working and sharing in a community setting.

2024 ARTS EDUCATION GRANT - \$20,966

Supports artist residencies for rich artistic learning experiences in schools and after-school programs.


2024 SPECIFIC OPPORTUNITY STIPEND (SOS) - \$56,078

Funded through a private foundation and funds raised by CAP, "SOS" grants provide funding for artists so that they can take part in important career opportunities (anywhere in the world).

2024 ARTS & CULTURAL ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT (ACOD) - \$345,000

CAP administers this program with funds from the Tompkins County Tourism Program. The goal is to stabilize and develop the major arts and cultural tourism assets of the County.
